KEY FACTS ABOUT IEGA: DID YOU KNOW?

- IEGA is in the business of “Encouraging the Can Do Attitude”. Since 1995, our coaches have had the pleasure of working with over 7,000 young athletes in North Idaho.
- We have over 25 specific fitness and gymnastics programs designed for children and adults ages 18 months and up!
- Over 75 young athletes currently compete for Team Avant Coeur (our competitive team). These gymnasts practice between 8 and 30 hours per week, every week, 51 weeks per year. There is NO OFF SEASON for gymnastics!
- At any given time, between 300 and 600 additional children and adults receive training at IEGA, ranging between one and ten hours per week!
- We are by far the most successful gymnastics facility in Idaho. At the 2009 Idaho State Gymnastics Meet, IEGA Coaches and Athletes had 20% of the Level 7 Gymnasts, 25% of Level 8, 33% of Level 9, and 68% of Level 10 Gymnasts! We were named the “Idaho State Optional Team of the Year”!
- We qualified 20 Athletes to the USAG Region 2 Meet in 2009. Only two other gyms in Region 2 qualified more (Region 2 includes ID, WA, OR, MT, AK and HI). All other gyms in North Idaho and Spokane Combined qualified only five athletes.
- Five of our Level 9 Athletes qualified to the Western National Championships, and four Level 10 Athletes qualified to the USAG National Championships. These were the only athletes in North Idaho, Montana or Eastern Washington to qualify for Nationals.
- IEGA Hosts the Great West Gym Fest, one of the premier Gymnastics Meets in the Nation, right here in Coeur d’Alene, Idaho every February. This meet brings 1100 to 1700 gymnasts, 3500 to 5000 spectators per year to Coeur d’Alene, and injects \$2-3 million per year into the local economy!
